Background

UniClaD project planned to have a number of study tours in key EC countries whose final objective is to support consortium partners in the development of Agrofood clusters in Moldovia, Ukraine and Azerbaijan. Specifically, each study tour will bring a group of expertise from these countries to know about consolidated experiences of agri-food clusters in EC contexts, learning about challenges for their set up and management. There will be a total of three visits to CIHEAM Bari and this proposal will focus on the first visit.

Period: May 22nd - 26th 2023

Target audience

Participants will be 12 people engaged on 4 specific Expertise Centre development in Ukraine, Azerbaijan and Moldova. For each EC will be admitted 3 persons belonging to High Education Institutions and Enterprises (2 and 1, or 1,1, 1 including a person from a public institution such as a municipality).

Participants must have a good knowledge of English to ensure a smooth and effective communication and interaction among the group and the Italian stakeholders.

Objectives

The study tour has as the main objective to present to participants cluster typologies that work for promoting territorial food systems based on local products valorization, multi-stakeholder partnerships, alternative food value chains.







Local stakeholder clusters will be chosen and proposed to the participants for their analysis. For instance, these might be the "Food District of Sud_Est Barese" and the "Biodistrict delle Lamie", both around the metropolitan area of Bari. Participants will have the opportunity to meet key actors in their territories and know more about the cluster's origins, scopes, partnerships, activities, innovation, and challenges.

Learning outcomes

The study tour will include seminars with experts, interviews and visits to key informants, workshops. At the end of the study tour participants will know about the basic conditions needed to set up successful clusters for sustainable farming and agri-food systems development. Specifically, they will understand:

- who are the **actors** that may take part to a cluster (motivations, roles and duties)
- what are the roles, duties and activities of the actors
- how to set up the clusters and typologies for their governance and financing
- how universities and research institutions may support clusters development.

Methodological approach

The methodology employed for the present study tour is based on action learning - open ended learning based on observation, dialogue, reflection, participation, and visioning. Action learning is an experiential learning method in which participants learn by doing and then reflecting on what they have done.

CIHEAM Bari as WP Task Leader, and Study Tour template designer has solid experience in application of action learning methodology through various projects and activities, with focus on agri-food sector, territorial development and building of social capital, all being of interests for clusters organizations in agri-food sector.

The methodology foresees following activities: field visits, seminars, classroom work and post-study reporting period.

Learning consists of programmed instruction (introduction to the methodology by the coach), participative action (visits and interactions with actors), critical reflection and questioning which aims to enable participants to help each other to explore better the situations they face and information they gain during the filed visits.

Main steps include direct interaction with key actors (research groups, incubators, private companies and cluster organizations) and its member entities. During the field visits each actor (stakeholder) and place visited are considered as different learning arenas. Participants' engagement is based on knowledge acquisition, peer and co-learning in groups, experimental learning and complex problemsolving.

During the activities in the classroom participants should reflect and on each part of their field activities in written and/or oral form to serve them as co-learning activity and repository for final reporting. Group work, interactions, dialogue and individual reflection and visioning will result among other with **key success factors list** to be transferred to their home organizations.

Assessment will be performed in the form of self-evaluation, individual report and group presentation.







\Rightarrow Before the tour

- Sharing roles and responsibilities within the hosting institution staff (An overall Coordinator will be selected for the Visit, who will be the only contact to facilitate the flow of the activity. Coordinator will be supported by others)
- Identification of theme and selection of participants
- Identification of the lecturers
- Identification of the organizations where the visits will take place and programming of the filed visits (As per the agenda, ideally a mixed of organizations will be expected e.g. research centres, spin-offs, technology parks, companies, universities. etc)
- Preparation of study materials and organization of traveling for visits
- Identification of communication channels with the participants
- Logistics: accommodation and traveling support for participants

\Rightarrow During the tour

- Logistic around lectures and visits
- Support to participants
- Daily wrap-up meeting, with feedback from participants to adapt for the rest of the activities and improve for future tours.
- On the final day, presentation given by the participants about the achievement of learning outcomes

\Rightarrow After the tour

- Feedback meeting at the hosting institution level
- Reporting
- Lessons learned and up-scaling for the next visit in other EU partners
- Follow-up of the participants experience in the form of short evaluation questionnaire
