A SUCCESSFUL CONFERENCE ON CARBON FARMING UNDER THE GECO 2.2 PROJECT

The Carbon Farming outreach conference, held on 7 March at Erchie (Brindisi) as part of the GECO 2.2 project, funded by the Interreg Italy-Croatia programme, attracted significant interest and participation.

Organised in partnership with the **Municipality of Erchie** and the **Professional Association of Agronomists of the Province of Brindisi**, the event gathered sector experts, institutions, and stakeholders. It provided a valuable platform for discussing the opportunities presented by carbon credits in agriculture, as well as the latest developments introduced by European Regulation 3012/2024.

Key Interventions:

- Vincenzo Verrastro (CIHEAM Bari) highlighted Italy's key role in implementing the new regulation: «Italy has begun implementing EU Regulation 3012/2024 on carbon farming, marking the start of a long journey which will require agriculture to curb CO₂ emissions through sustainable conservation practices. With the expertise gained from the GECO2 and GECO2.2 projects, with a special focus on this issue since 2018, CIHEAM Bari is well-equipped to face this change».
- **Simona Giordano** (CIHEAM Bari) emphasised CIHEAM Bari's commitment, alongside its partners, to promoting sustainable practices: «In close collaboration with international partners, CIHEAM Bari has carried out a wide range of project activities. Starting in 2018 with the GECO2 project and continuing since last year with GECO2.2, we have pursued a path focused on carbon farming and voluntary carbon credit markets, aiming in particular to support the territory and its stakeholders».

The event highlighted the growing interest in strategies for mitigating CO2 emissions in agriculture, supported by an increasingly structured European regulatory framework and the ongoing commitment of research institutions and public bodies.
